Since we must vacate the Giant at 8:30 PM sharp, we'll need to start our meeting at 6:30 PM (instead of our usual 7:30 PM). However, we would like to start an informal session at 6:00 PM, then officially start the meeting at 6:30 PM.

At the June meeting our subject was "Gadgets and Jigs Used in Micromounting". The members and guests shared the tricks of the trade that they have acquired over the years in making micromounts. Some of the items and techniques included: obtaining the specimen in the field using a variety of collecting secrets; braking down the specimen with chisels and hammers, nippers and pliers, rock trimmers and saws; cleaning the specimen using pressurized water streams, via hoses, pressure washers and textile guns, or using ultrasonic cleaners and some chemical solutions. It was then on to prepare the specimen for the final mount in the micromount box using box templates, labeling insert tools and a variety of tweezers, glues, markers, pedestal material and even temporary use of mineral tack. Everyone who attended had some specialty technique that was shared. An attempt was made to help preserve these techniques via a spur of the moment video recording.

In other Society business, final preparations were made for the September 7, 2024, 9:30 AM to 12:00 Noon joint meeting/demonstration on Diatoms at the Delaware County Institute of Science

with the Philadelphia Society for Microscopy. Due to changes in our meeting time and location the Society's By-Laws will require updating. The Society was recently contacted by the heirs of George Butler to evaluate his mineral collection for an upcoming auction. Finally, the September meeting will feature micromounts from Ray Strohmeier. Members and guests are requested to bring in for viewing your six best/unusual Ray Strohmeier mounts from your collection.
